# STATE PARKS

3 trails programs - Recreational Trails Program, Off-Highway Vehicle Program, Land and Water Conservation Fund.

- RTP
  - Trail Maintenance Fund Existing maintenance of non-motorized trails.
  - Safety and Environmental Education (SEE) Program both motorized and non-motorized projects
- Off Highway
  - Trail development and Trial maintenance for off road motorized vehicles.
  - Mitigation and Emergency Repairs on designated OHV routes.
    - These are approved at the Staff level so that they can be approved very quickly
  - Enforcement opportunities and educational opportunities on public lands
  - Signage grants must be in designated OHV areas
- LWCF primarily land acquisition program

Overview of the individual RTP projects that were approved.

- Grand Canyon Conservancy \$147k to upgrade the South Kaibab Trail with Trail crews.
- City of Peoria \$142k Developing ADA connectivity at WestWing Park
- Verde River Institute \$29.7k Funding an on-river ambassador on using the river safely
- Apache-Sitgreaves = \$290k Build 10 miles of new trail in the Maverick Trail system, maintain 12 miles of trail and install signage.
- SEE Program: A diverse funding opportunity
  - Verde Valley Cyclists \$8k to support the Red Rock Mountain Bike Patrol uniforms, backpacks, first aid kits
  - AZ Board of Regents = \$9k to develop a video to educate hikers about hydrating in the heat to stay safe
  - AZ Trail Association \$9k for the support of the Network for AZ Trails

- Lost Dutchman State Park- \$7k to develop exploration packs for use by guests to help them learn more about the natural environment.
- Arizona Game and Fish \$10k to develop a statewide birding trail website
- NOHVCC \$9k to develop a trail building workshop on the Coronado National Forest for sustaining OHV trails
- SDMB \$7k to expand on their "Be Cool" Campaign for trail etiquette signs
- OHV Program
  - AZ State Lands \$1.5mil to complete a non-urban land management plan to inventory existing motorized trails on State Land, making that inventory available to the public.
  - AZ State Parks \$113k to increase public outreach efforts with dealerships and events statewide. Including maps and guides on trail etiquette and LNT materials.
  - Natural Restorations \$237k additional cleanups in OHV staging areas. There were several of these submitted recently by other groups as well.
  - Apache-Sitgreaves NF = \$28k to purchase a new OHV for conducting patrols to help with enforcement.
  - AZ State Parks = \$13k emergency mitigation on an OHV trail in Buckskin Mountain State Parks too technical for beginner users causing a number of accidents.
- LWCF Projects scored based on the Statewide Recreation Plan. Acting Stakeholders should contact Dawn Collins for more information. Kicking off the process for the new Statewide Comprehensive Recreation Plan starting in April if you'd like to be involved please reach out to Dawn.
  - Town of Camp Verde \$2.5mil to develop a new sport complex (active rec) will also connect with several miles of non-motorized trails.
  - City of Show Low \$600k Develop playground
  - City of Chandler = \$750k for a new park and trail head at Homestead North Park

### Concurrent Resolution: Get Outdoors Arizona Update

Kirk Astroth: Crossover week at the Legislature. Rules Committee is meeting to review the resolution for adherence to the basic rules of the body. 38 individual organizations have stepped up to support the resolution.

- On the Senate side: passed easily from the Natural Resources committee and the Rules Committee. Added to the Consent Calendar and transmitted to the House on the 18th.
- On the House side: passed the Resources Committee and the Rules Committee. Being reviewed by the caucuses and added to the Consent Calendar.
- Could be approved/passed unanimously by later today!
- Sets the stage for us to move forward with some of the other pieces that we discussed at the Summit.

Because of the stage of where we are at, if you're registered in the RTS system you can't use it because it's out of the committees. You need to directly connect with your legislators.

Monthly Theme Brainstorm:

- Generalized information about what's happening statewide and specific projects going on in different parts of the state, is very beneficial to know where to start looking for resources.
   AOT, State Parks, Problems in other areas
- State Land Department and State Parks Non-urban management plan how can organization be involved in this. (talk to Jackie)
- I'd like to see more discussions geared towards finding consensus amongst the trail & land managers. I think this group could be that committee that brings forth MAG standards for trails to continue to improve consistency from agency to agency.
